#### **Elections**

There will be no elections. With the cancelation of the 2022 Triennial Meeting the National ECW board has decided to stay in place for the next 2 years. As we had no nominations for Province 1 ECW officers, the executive committee will meet in June, some of us will continue, and others will be appointed.

**Bylaw amendment**: to remove the Church Periodical Club representative as an elected position. Rationale:

The Church Periodical Club is a separate 501c3 organization. Province 1 ECW has been responsible for electing a Province 1 representative to the CPC but the reality is this has been primarily an appointment. It would be best to shift this appointment to CPC, an ECW "affiliated agency", and have the person part of the Province 1 ECW Board like other affiliated agencies. This does not conflict with the current CPC bylaws.

MOTION: to remove the Church Periodical Club representative as an elected position and amend all sections of the bylaws pertaining to the Church Periodical Club.

There was no discussion Rowan Larson seconded the motion; the vote was unanimous.
